**G**REETINGS AND HAPPY NINETEEN-NINETY-SIX:

1995 HAS BEEN A GOOD YEAR for me, as I hope it has been for you. In October I celebrated my first year on the staff of the Northern Textile Association and the American Flock Association. There has been much to learn and it has been much work, but I love my job and look forward to many years here. The disastrous mill fire December 11 at Malden Mills Industries in Methuen, Mass. has been quite a shock to us. Malden is one of the largest and most successful mills in New England. Aaron Feuerstein, Malden's president, has vowed to reopen in Massachusetts, and to pay the 1,400 workers while rebuilding. This man of devout Jewish faith has justly paid back the workers for the concessions they made in the 1980's when Malden was losing money and nearly went out of business.

IF THE SNOW CONTINUES we shall see one of the snowiest winters in Boston history. Already we have seen more snow than falls the entire season some years. Our current overabundance of frozen precipitation contrasts with the drought that afflicted New England through the summer of 1995. Last winter saw record warm, so much so that, for lack of ice, I skated on the frog pond in the Public Garden but once.

My City Committee had its first substantial victory this year when a Democratic incumbent School Committee Member switched parties and was re-elected this November as a Republican, becoming the first Republican to win a local office in Cambridge in many years.

The founding of a Greater Boston Chapter of the Christian Coalition with its headquarters in Cambridge and the relocation of the Conservative Society of Massachusetts from Boston to Cambridge have made Cambridge the center of conservative thought in the Commonwealth. As could be expected, my success has made me the target of liberals in the city, in particular the mayor who recently attacked me in a front page story in our local weekly paper, the Cambridge Chronicle.

I CONTINUE TO WORSHIP, and occasionally help as an usher, at the Church of the Advent (Episcopal) in Boston. Unfortunately the parish is in the midst of an internal struggle that has broken out into a civil law-suit.
